**Pain Management**

Animals treated for pain recovery faster from anesthesia and heal more quickly from surgery. The veterinary surgeon will select an appropriate medication for your pet if he/she feels pain medication is indicated. One or both may be sent home if the doctor deems that pain medication is necessary. Long acting injection (\$20.00 -\$25.00) and/or take home (liquid or tablets) - (\$20.00 -\$40.00). Actual cost depends on patient's weight

**Teeth Extractions**

Extractions will be at the discretion of the veterinary surgeon and for the animal's best interest regarding overall health. Please understand the risks involved to your pet when unhealthy teeth are not removed. Common issues include: cardiovascular disease, chronic sinus infections, tissue loss, bone loss, and systemic infections. Cost of extraction varies between \$2.00 - \$20.00 per tooth depending on severity of removal; and is the responsibility of the owner.

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**Pre-Anesthetic Blood Work**

We recommend all patients (with emphasis on middle-aged and older animals) have blood work prior to anesthesia to assess organ function and detect potential problems that may require alternate modalities of treatment or deem the patient unfit for anesthesia. Blood work evaluation includes, but is not limited to: RBC's (anemia, dehydration), WBC's (presence of infection), Glucose (hyper/hypoglycemia, diabetes), Kidney Enzymes, Liver Enzymes, and Electrolytes.

**Vaccination, Heartworm, FIV/FELV**

Current rabies vaccination is required by State Law. Additional vaccinations are encouraged for the prevention of disease in animals and humans, as some animal disease are Zoonotic (transmittable to humans).

**Deciduous Extractions (Baby) Teeth**

Extractions will be at the discretion of the veterinary surgeon and for the animal’s best interest regarding overall health of your animal.

**Microchip**
